

## **View Mahler's conducting scores at Southampton University on Wednesday 29 March**

Not everyone knows that Southampton University's Hartley Library holds a magnificent collection of 42 conducting scores used by Mahler during his time in Vienna.

Members of the Gustav Mahler Society UK will have an opportunity to see the collection on **29 March**, with our visit commencing at **2.30 pm**.

On view will be conducting scores for Beethoven, 2nd, 3rd and 9th symphonies as well as the 5th piano concerto and the overture to Coriolanus. Schubert's 9th – the Great C Major – is also there, together with Mahler's own 1st and 3rd symphonies and a leaf from a sketch for part of the 3rd movement of the 9th symphony.

Like many conductors of his time, Mahler made alterations to scores in his repertoire including Beethoven's symphonies and numerous annotations which are also of great interest.

We shall be given a talk about the scores, and there will be an opportunity to see other exhibits in the library.
